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Many of you may have heard of The Grenfell Tower fire which occurred on 14 June 2017 at the 24-storey, 220-foot-high (67 m), Grenfell Tower block of public housing flats in North Kensington, Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea, West London. It caused at least 80 deaths and over 70 injuries. The fire started in a fridge-freezer on the fourth floor. The growth of the fire is believed to have been accelerated by the building's exterior cladding. Many friends and family were lost on this tragic day. Our condolences to those who lost there loved ones.

Just under a month later another horrifying fire incident took place in Bolton which killed a mother and her three young children. The fire was started after the youngsters tried to charge an iPad but accidently switched on a halogen heater.

These incidents have opened eyes for all to take further safety precautions and it is important to ensure that we are prepared if incidents like these were to occur again. These are a few tips to ensure house safety which could potentially save a life.

- 1. Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas.
- Test smoke alarms every month. If they're not working, change the batteries.
- 3. Talk with all family members about a fire escape plan and practice the plan twice a year.
- 4. Take care not to lean over hot hobs and keep tea towels and cloths away from the cooker and hob.
- 5. Be careful to keep the oven, hob, cooker hood and grill clean to avoid a build up of fat and grease, which could ignite and cause a
- 6. Never put anything metal in the microwave.
- 7. Don't overload plug sockets.
- 8. Regularly check for frayed or worn cables and wires
- If a fire occurs in your home, GET OUT, STAY OUT and CALL FOR HELP. Never go back inside for anything or anyone.
